The Commander's Corner...

During the months of July and August we have had some good things happen that I'd like to share with you. We are also facing some challenges that may be of interest too. Starting out on the positive side, I hope everyone has noticed the mulch and flowers that we have in front of the Post. This was done entirely by volunteers (too many to name them all). Many thanks to the Building Committee and those that sacrificed their time and effort to enhance the appearance of our Post. A special thanks needs to go out to the Wenzler Family - they donated quite a bit of money from the "Ron Wenzler Fund" to help cover the costs for the 20 yards of mulch that was put down in the front of the Post.

The second weekend in July we hosted the 5th annual Ohio Veterans BBQ Competition. There were 44 teams in the competition and first place prize went to the team of "Chix, Swine and Bovine" - a team from Jessup, Maryland. Hats off to the BBQ committee and all those that volunteered to make this such an enjoyable event.

In the past, you've heard a lot about Verizon paying us a monthly fee to put up a cell tower behind our Post. Great news, we got our first check in July. While it appears as though Verizon will not actually build the new cell tower until 2012, contractually, they had to start paying us rent by August 1st.

Many may not know that we currently have accounts in three different banks. Each bank charges our Post monthly "banking fees" depending on the type and number of transactions. Mike Kling, our Finance Officer, and Dave Tracy, our Canteen Manager, have been negotiating with three local banks to see if we could get some of our banking costs reduced. I am happy to share with you that they have been very successful - we are going to consolidate all our accounts under one banking facility (PNC). PNC has agreed to waive all start up fees and virtually all other miscellaneous monthly banking fees for our Post. As a part of this initiative, we are exploring a credit card operation for our Post where Post members can use charge cards for purchases they make at our establishment. More will be coming on the credit card operation as we get closer to finalizing this effort.

Another initiative to increase our revenue comes from our Banquet Room. Specifically, Mr. Bill Thomas, our Banquet Room Manager, committed to catering a wedding. This is a first for our Post. Based on feedback from our customer and from our observations, the catering initiative went very well and the profit was well worth the effort. I would hope that everyone would keep it in mind and share the fact that we not only have a banquet hall for rent, but we will also cater events in the banquet hall.

Hail damage update: The Building Committee has

accepted a lot of different proposals from contractors to repair the hail damage to our building. The Building Committee has also been working with our insurance company and have secured the funds to complete the repair work. The Building Committee has been very active in a very time consuming effort to insure that we get a sound quality repair effort from any contractor that works on our building. Another outstanding effort by the Building Committee.

We have a couple of fund raising events coming up in the next couple of months. Please note that we have the 15th annual Rocky Couch Golf Outing on September 18th. While many of you may not know or remember Rocky Couch, I'm sure that you have all heard of Hospice. All proceeds/profits from this golf outing are donated to Hospice and that is the important thing to remember. Get your group together and plan on having a great day of golf, food, and refreshments.

We are having another bus trip to Hollywood Casino. Those that participated in the last bus trip to the Hollywood Casino can share with you how great it was - a very comfortable bus for the roundtrip, beverages on the bus, games on the bus, a buffet at the casino and a lot of laughter. We even had some winners!!! Now is your chance to try this again. Seating is limited so get in touch with one of our bartenders and sign up early.

There is a Monte Carlo scheduled for October 1st. We will be serving our famous cod dinner for this event and will have a lot of games to play such as black jack, Texas Holdem, showdown and more. 
